ADA members including 4 Steering Committee members also contributed to this meeting by leading A4SD's Working Groups as well as sharing their views on the principles and governance structure.



CSO Engagement on the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

Mainstreaming human rights and democracy in implementation of the
Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Asia

10-17 August 2016, Bangkok, Thailand

The 4th Glocal Advocacy Leadership in Asia Academy (GALAA) will be held on 10-17 August in Bangkok. So far 41 candidates were initially short-listed for the first round of the selection process. During the period of the GALA Academy 4, there are two events to be held in Bangkok in regards to the implementation of SDGs.

- Regional Consultation on the Establishment of "Asia Civil Society Partnership for Sustainable Development" (APSD) (Bangkok, 14 August, 2016): The regional consultation aims to provide a space for sharing the information about global processes such as A4SD and discussing effective responses and strategies among Asian CSOs that have engaged in the post-2015 development agenda and now SDGs.
- 2. Asian Civil Society Forum (ACSF) on SDGs 16 (Bangkok, 15-16 August, 2016): The Asian Forum is expected to assess the outcome of the HLPF 2016 in July 2016, especially the voluntary national review of Asian countries in terms of developing follow-up action including effective national action planning for the SDGs.

The open invitations for these events will be sent soon!
